While defeating his enemies in battle, terror and violence strikes the general's home, devastating his fragile relations with his family, and culminating in total disaster. Exposing the ever-existing thin line between love and violence, nature's cruelty and social rules, Sophocles' ancient tragedy 'Trachiniae' is transported in Martin Crimp's new play to contemporary times, that of political hupocrisy, power struggles and moral arbitrariness.
