The Feldman's are gathered together to celebrate Passover Seder of 2003 in the family hotel on the coast of Netanya. The time is the height of Al-Aqsa Intifada, the night of the terror attack on Park Hotel, not far from them. But the family members dwell deep in their own private family mess. The firstborn brother, Yossi, wants to tell everyone that he intends on marrying his younger brother's ex-girlfriend. The mother dominated with an iron fist, and the rest of the family tries to survive through the holiday dinner, when an unexpected guest appears, bringing more chaos with them. This hilarious, thrilling, moving and disturbing play explores the boundaries of insanity in this typical Israeli family. Can he, who tells the truth, be considered normal? Is there a remedy in exposing the family's painful secrets? The play tries to answer the questions through the four sons in the Feldman family – the wise one, the simple one, the wicked one, and the one who does not know how to ask a question.
