His intention is to make up to the niece in order to get his hands on any material that the old lady might have about Aspern. The niece discovers his intentions and is quite horrified at them.

At the same time she has become very fond of the man – indeed. He has been successful in his original intention! After the death of the old lady Tina makes H.J. an offer of the papers – if he will merry her everything that is hers would be his also... but he knows that this would be dishonourable and sadly leaves the house. Miss Tina now possesses the papers. Rejected, she burns them.
